

The New PPE Regulation (EU) 2016/425

The New Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Regulation (EU) 2016/425 redefines the responsibilities for all actors in the PPE supply chain in order to reduce the chances of non-compliant PPE. It is designed to improve traceability, reinforce market controls and deliver a more collaborative system for market surveillance. ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE NEW PPE REGULATION (EU) 2016/425

Your key responsibilities as an end-user

- Under the terms of new PPE Regulation
 (EU) 2016/425 all 'Economic Operators' will
 be responsible for compliance, including
 manufacturers, importers and distributors.
 While buying PPE for your consumption
 (end-user), you don't have any new
 responsibilities, though, there are some
 important information you should know
- As an end-user your responsibilities remain the same
- It comes into full force on 21 April 2019 and certificates based on the old PPE directive will remain valid until 21 April 2023 or, if they expire before that date, sooner
- All PPE will have to be certified to the new Regulation 2016/425 and latest state of the art EN standards, at the latest when the old certificates (based on the Directive) expire but not later than 21 April 2023
- The new regulation covers design, manufacture and marketing of PPE and requires that it is traceable across the supply chain which provides essential requirements to ensure the highest levels of protection
- It should make it easier to remove dangerous PPE from the market and bring more trust and safety to PPE
