



The RightCycle™ Industrial Program Frequently Asked Questions

Q What is the RightCycle Program?

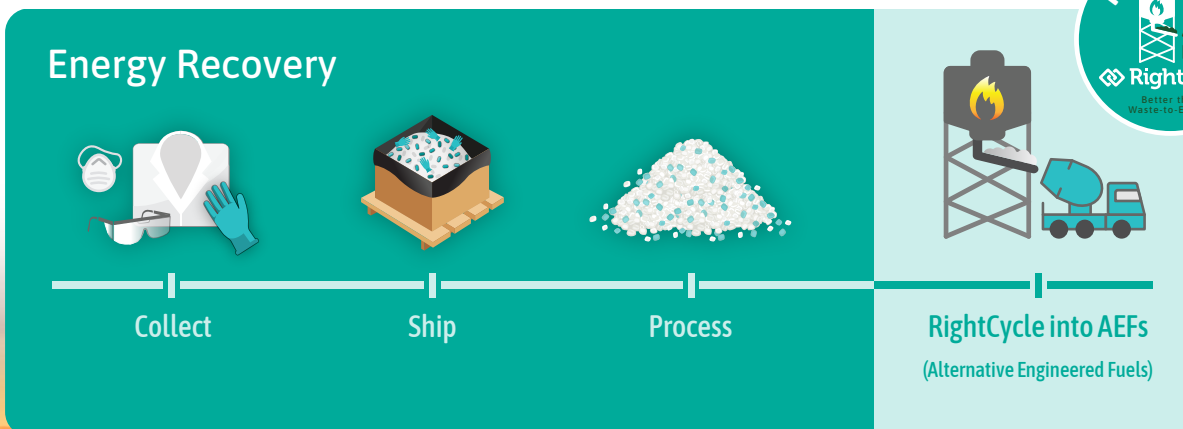
RightCycle is the first manufacturer-led landfill diversion program for non-hazardous PPE including single-use apparel and accessories, masks, nitrile and latex gloves, protective eyewear, and flex-film packaging for Ansell branded products.

The new RightCycle Industrial service diverts used Ansell branded PPE from the landfill by creating Alternative Engineered Fuels (AEFs) with the materials. AEFs are used in a variety of industrial applications such as cement manufacturing to replace fossil fuels such as coal. Since 2011, RightCycle has responsibly diverted 7.0 million pounds of used Ansell branded PPE from the landfill.

Q How does the RightCycle Industrial Program work?

Implementation is easy. Customers collect qualifying items in their facilities. The items are then shipped to our recycling partners in a stackable Gaylord box (24"H or 48"H) on a pallet, using the customer's preferred carrier. (See additional information about collection boxes and shipping below.)

The used products are converted into AEFs that are then used in various industrial applications.



Q How do I enroll in RightCycle?

Email RightCycle@ansell.com to get connected with **WasteBits™**, a web-based platform that enables you to manage and monitor your waste diversion efforts online. Team members will walk you through the online registration process and help you obtain approval from our recycling partners. Registration and sign-up are typically completed within a 15-minute virtual meeting.

Please note: Only approved Ansell branded products are accepted to ensure that they are suitable for the program. In addition, the products must not be exposed to hazardous contaminants or require special handling or disposal.

Q How can I ensure a successful implementation in my facility?

Implementation is easy! Your Ansell sales professional can help by accompanying you on a site walk and advise you on the best places and ways to collect waste for the program. Our RightCycle Specialist can also walk you through the process and answer any questions that you may have. For information, email RightCycle@ansell.com.

Q Can I use my own boxes if I want to?

Yes. To be more sustainable, we encourage customers to use containers that are readily available to collect used Ansell branded PPE at the point of use. We can provide labels, free of charge, to help identify the collection bins. If you do not have boxes, we can provide a limited number of boxes for point-of-use collection only.

Please note: RightCycle program collection boxes are not to be used for shipping.

Q Can I collect different types of PPE in a single collection box?

Yes. All eligible Ansell PPE can be co-mingled in the Gaylord box, along with any flex-film packaging that the Ansell PPE was shipped in.

Q Can I include other PPE that is not manufactured by Ansell?

No. You can only send eligible Ansell branded products to RightCycle. These products have been tested to ensure that they can be converted into engineered fuels and provide consistent performance in kiln operations.

Q Are all Ansell branded products eligible for RightCycle?

No. Not all Ansell branded products are approved for the program. Please work with your Ansell sales professional to ensure you are collecting ONLY approved products for the program.



Q Where can I get a full list of products that are eligible for RightCycle?

Q Is there a cost to participate in RightCycle?

There is no cost to participate in the program. The only direct expense is that you must pay to ship your used products to our recycling partners, using your preferred carrier.

SHIPPING INFORMATION

Q How should I ship my used products to your recycling partners?

All eligible Ansell PPE must be shipped in a stackable Gaylord box, either 24" or 48" in height, and placed on a pallet.

The contents of each box should be clearly marked on the outside.

Stackable Gaylords must be secured to a standard wooden pallet and shrink-wrapped. The dimensions of a standard pallet are 40" x 48". Please refer to your carrier's weight and pallet guidelines for more information.



Q Do I need to do anything special to identify the pallet when I ship it?

You must log into your WasteBits account to notify us of the upcoming shipment. WasteBits will verify the shipping procedures, shipping address and assign a unique AF# that will be used for tracking shipments and waste diversion metrics.



**Q Is there a way for me to reduce my shipping costs?
Does RightCycle help pay for shipping?**

RightCycle will not pay for freight costs. However, we encourage our customers to contact WasteBits to obtain a freight quote if needed. You can contact a consultant at WasteBits directly by logging into your RightCycle account on the [Wastebits website](#).

THE ENERGY RECOVERY PROCESS AND HOW IT WORKS

Q Where does the used PPE material go? What do your partners do with it?

All shipments are individually weighed and logged into WasteBits once received. Materials are then consolidated and forwarded to VLS Environmental Solutions where it is used to create Alternative Engineered Fuels, a more sustainable substitute for fossil fuels.

Q How do I know that RightCycle is a legitimate landfill diversion solution?

We are transparent about the energy recovery process and provide you with details on what is occurring at every step. Additionally, Ansell annually audits our program partners and verifies all process claims.

By converting PPE into Alternative Engineered Fuels for cement kilns, RightCycle offers a cleaner, regulated alternative to landfilling. This reduces emissions, eliminates contaminated PPE waste, and helps produce the cement needed for hospitals, schools, homes, and essential infrastructure.



Q How do I know if RightCycle is working and how can I confirm how much waste I'm diverting?

You can track the amount of product and weight diverted from landfills by going to the [Wastebits online portal](#) and downloading simple graphs and exportable data. Additionally, each year, our Greenovation™ Awards honor companies for demonstrating sustainability leadership and reducing their environmental impact by participating in landfill diversion programs.

Q Is it possible to conduct an audit of your recycling facilities?

Yes. We can complete any audit paperwork you require. And, we are happy to hold in-person, on-site audits. Please submit your request to RightCycle@ansell.com.

Q Are there any tax benefits or financial incentives for participating in RightCycle?

Programs, credits, and incentives vary widely on a state-by-state basis in the U.S. and in Canada. Programs generally incentivize the processors rather than the people who are generating the waste. We recommend that you check the guidelines in your state or province for information about any programs that may benefit your business.
